

# Constellation Fund Outcomes Report

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November 2025

## Summary

The November 2025 grant round increased Constellation Fund’s lifetime grant distributions to \$22,607,449. **With just over \$2.5 million in grants this round, Constellation’s contributions are expected to generate more than \$22.7 million in benefits** through services that improve health and increase income for **134,858 people** living in poverty (table 1). This is both the most grant dollars given in one grant round and the highest benefits produced of any prior grant round in Constellation’s history. The number of people impacted is higher than previous investment rounds due to the wide reach of a food distribution organization, a youth sexual health organization, and children’s dental service organizations.

## Outcome Report Details

Constellation’s November 2025 grantees provide a variety of services (table 2) leading to important outcomes for people living in poverty in the Twin Cities (table 3). Primary services range from career training to school improvement to housing legal aid to children’s dental care. Each service results in outcomes leading to one or two types of benefits: improved health or increased earnings (table 3).

For example, food distribution (service) leads to increased food security (outcome), which yields lasting health and income increases (benefits).

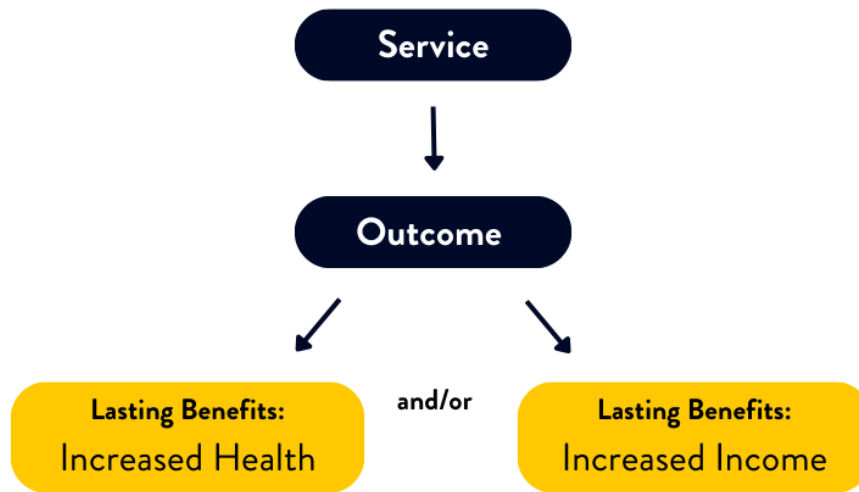
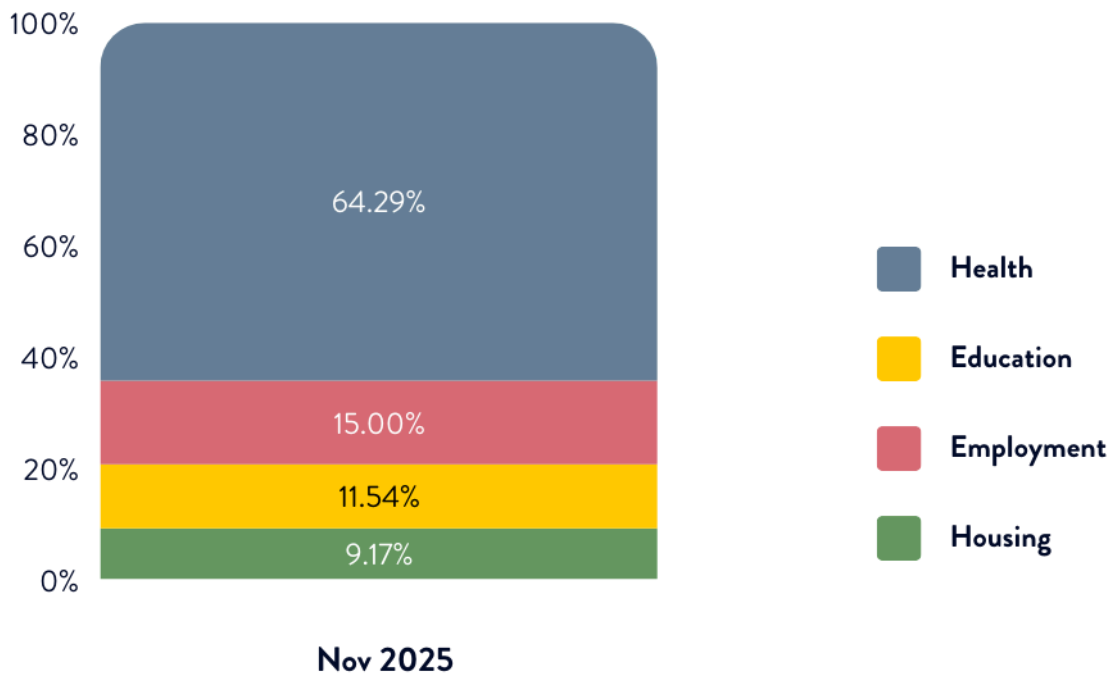

In November 2025, Constellation awarded grants to 15 community organizations across four issue areas (employment, housing, education, and health). Constellation’s investment supplies strategic support toward grantee services whose lasting health and income benefits amount to more than \$22.7 million. The health issue area sees the most Constellation funded benefits this funding round with an estimated \$14.6 million in benefits.

In total, all services provided by the organizations in Constellation’s portfolio are expected to produce over \$419 million in lasting health and income benefits for participants. Constellation’s grants will fund approximately 5% of the overall benefits produced by each grantee this round.

Oral health services like fluoride application, dental restoration, endodontic procedures or tooth extraction leading to oral cavity treatment outcomes have the highest health benefits for participants this grant round, with an estimated \$83.6 million of benefits across grantees providing these services. Education services like General Education Development (GED) and college credit leading to adult educational attainment outcomes have the highest increased income benefits for participants this grant round, with an estimated \$78.3 million of benefits across grantees providing these services.
